- ◆ By using the purchasing power of ACC Members, ACES has obtained lower energy rates than currently available to many small or medium size business (**SAVINGS OF UP TO 25%**)

Many ACC Members are on the Regulated Rate Option (RRO)

- ◆ For the last 3 years (2011-2013), the average RRO price was 9.4 cents per kWh
- ◆ ACES has negotiated a price with ENMAX of 6.98 cents per kWh, for a 3 year contract
- ◆ This represents a *savings of close to 25%* below the RRO price

- ◆ The ACC program can also be extended to include residences for owners and key managers. Special conditions apply. The residence can only be added as a second location on the commercial business account.

Frequently asked questions

- 1) Can I get in the program if I currently have an energy contract? (unfortunately “no” as energy contracts have penalty clauses which are detrimental in the event a member wants to cancel. Check with your current provider and mark you calendar to join the ACC program when your contract expires)
- 2) If I sign up, do I have an option to get out of the contract within the ACC program? (as in all energy contracts, penalty clauses are included)
- 3) Do I have to do anything with my current provider? (no, once you complete the online sign up process, Enmax and ACES does the rest)
- 4) Who sends me the bill? (Enmax will send you the new billings for the 3 year term)
- 5) What are my options to pay? (direct withdrawal, online or by cheque)
- 6) Does this program help with administration, transmission or distribution fees? (no, these types of fees are regulated by other government bodies)
- 7) My gas bill is included with my electricity bill. How does that work? (we can offer both as well)
